Standing Order No. 9. ~~1957.~~

Subject:- Use of Police Orderlies.

A case has just come to ~~my~~ notice in which one ^Gazetted Police Officer took ^{an} entirely raw recruit as his personal orderly and then sent him away to his private house at a place more than 100 miles away ^{in another District} and kept him there for over 15 months. I have reported this misuse of a Policeman to Government for disciplinary action against the ^Gazetted Officer concerned.

2. The attention of all Police officers is drawn to rule 79 of the Rajasthan Police Regulations, 1948 and they are ^{requested} ~~expected~~ to strictly abide by it. Police orderlies are given to certain superior Police officers only for duty at their residences ~~at~~ ⁱⁿ the places of posting and not at private places miles away. An officer can ^{however} ~~of course~~ take his orderly with him when he has to visit another place on duty, ~~but that is entirely a separate matter.~~

3. It is hoped that officers will now be very careful about the use of Police orderlies. They are strictly forbidden ^{unofficially} ~~to get~~ local Policemen as orderlies at places other than their HQs.

It is understood that certain officer ^s ~~who~~ have private houses ^{at} ~~at~~ ^{another place} ~~some places~~ are in the habit of requesting the local Superintendent or Circle Officer to detail a Policeman or two for duty at these private houses. This practice should ~~be~~ ~~stopped~~ immediately.
