Standing Order No. 1 ✓

Dated, Jaipur, the 9/15 Sept. 1970

In exercise of the powers conferred on me under rule 19(3) of the Rajasthan Police Subordinate Service Rules 1966, the syllabus for the examination for direct recruitment to the posts of Sub-Inspectors in Civil Police (including Prosecution Branch) and Armed Police is laid-down as in Appendix A.

The written examination shall consist of two papers for competition and one paper for qualifying for such candidates who do not offer Hindi as one of the compulsory subjects in High School/Higher Secondary Examination. The written papers for competition examination shall carry 200 marks.

This is in supersession of this more standing order no. 1 of 1967.

Appendix 'A'

Syllabus for written Examination for direct recruitment to the posts of S.Is. C.P. (including Prosecution Branch) and Armed Police under the Rajasthan Police Subordinate Services Rules 1966.

There shall be two written papers of 3 hours duration carrying 100 marks each.

Ist. Paper on Essay Writing.

This paper is intended to test the knowledge of the candidate in his power of thinking, formulation and expression of ideas of a subject and tests his ability in conveying his ideas coherently. The subjects for essay would include matters of topical interest and would cover variety of choice to suit candidates coming from different faculties. Emphasis would be laid on ~~providing~~ brevity, good expression, systematic thinking and fresh application on the subject chosen by the candidate. The standard for examination shall be that of a B.A. (Pass) Degree.

IInd Paper on General Knowledge.

This paper is intended to test general knowledge of the candidate in current affairs, matters of topical importance and in general understanding of men, matters and events happening in various branches of human knowledge. Candidates are expected to know elementary details of Indian Constitution, the country, History, Geography, political developments and recent advances in science and technology, which a man of ordinary intelligence should know by reading news-papers and through his study for graduate classes. The paper shall generally be of B.A. standard and will offer sufficient choice for candidates hailing from

different places and branches of knowledge.

IIIrd Paper Hindi (Qualifying)

This paper of 3 hours' duration shall carry 50 marks and is intended only for such candidates who did not offer Hindi as a compulsory subject in High School/Higher Secondary Examination. This paper is only a qualifying paper and the marks obtained in this are not added to the competitive papers.

General:

Pass marks for compulsory papers are 33% individually and 40% aggregate. Pass marks for qu papers in Hindi are 33%.
