**STANDING ORDER NO. 11**

Sub: Programme for IPS/RPS Probationers- Practical Training after initial training.

Ref: IGP's Standing Order No.2 dt.16.6.'71 and Standing Order No. 3 dated 28.12.'71.

In partial modification of the above Standing Orders it is laid down that the Weekly Working Diaries of the Probationers (IPS/RPS) will be forwarded in duplicate to the District Supdts. of Police under whom the Probationer is working for Practical Training. Timely submission of these diaries is to be ensured by the District Superintendents of Police.

2. District Supdts. of Police will forward one diary with their comments to the Dy. Is. G.P. Range and one diary to the Dy. I.G.P., Training. The Dy. I.G.P. Range will closely watch the progress of the Probationer during training and would issue necessary guidance/directions to the Superintendents of Police for improvement in Training wherever necessary for emphasizing particular aspect of the training in which the Probationer may be found deficient. A copy of such guidance/direction issued by the Range Dy. I.G.P. will also be sent to the Dy. I.G.P. Training.


3. The Dy. I.G.P. Training will also keep in touch with the progress of Practical Training of Probationer and will issue suitable guidance/direction to the Trainee and the Distt. Ss.P. under whom he is being imparted Practical Trg. Such instructions will be in addition to the Orders issued by the I.G.P. on the working diaries and comments received thereon from Ss.P/Range/& Trg. Dy. Is. G.P.

4. Scrutiny of the weekly working diaries of IPS/RPS Probationer received in the office of the DIGP Trg. so far indicated that the diaries are more in the nature of filing a return rather than furnishing detailed account of work of each day pertaining to individual items. The main purpose of preparing individual working diary is to get fair idea regarding the nature, quantum and quality of work performed by the Probationer so that it could be judged whether his training is progressive, whether his assimilation of practical knowledge of police working is satisfactory and whether his occupation of the practical training period is purposeful.

5. It need hardly to emphasise that inspite of instructions laid down on the subject for imparting practical training to gazetted police officers (Probs.) it depends on the personal interest, time devoted and personal guidance imparted by the Distt. Ss.P. under whom the probationer is trained. As the heading of the practical training itself suggests, the training is to be practice-oriented. If this period is not rightly and fully utilised by the Probationer for learning the intricacy of police work, thorough insight and does not develop his confidence in the job, the very purpose of practical training will remain unfulfilled. It is, therefore, desired that Distt. Ss.P. and other officers under whom gazetted police officers are trained should regard it as a matter of challenge and pride to impart technical know-how of the police to the young probationer in a manner that it is

properly imbued, rightly understood and thoroughly assimilated for implementation. In such training not only the quality and keenness of the probationer contributes towards the result but equally the senior officer under whom such training is imparted are equally contest.

6. I am confident that every senior police officer would strive hitherto to see that young gazetted officers are imparted training in proper fashion for the common task of police ahead and will contribute in an abundant measure for the correct shaping of the young generation.
