
STANDING ORDER NO. 6/83.

Under the provisions of Rajasthan Police Subordinate Service Rules, 1974, the names of those who qualify at the Qualifying Examination under Rule 24(i) are required to be arranged in order of seniority.

Secondly, according to the latest ~~ru~~ ruling of the State Appellate Tribunal on the subject of seniority any individual passing the P.C.C. becomes senior to those who pass this course on a later date. In other words, the most important factor in determining the seniority now is the date of passing the P.C.C. Hence, it becomes mandatory that people are nominated to this Course strictly according to the seniority list as drawn after the passing of the Qualifying Examination. Any deviation from this will be positively illegal and mischievous and the defaulter will have to be suitably dealt with.

It should, therefore, be ensured that the names in the qualifying list are arranged in correct order of seniority. Any body who is nominated to attend the P.C.C. but fails to undergo the course will do so at his own risk and is liable to be over-looked for promotion. An undertaking in writing should be taken from him that he is willingly foregoing the chance offered to him. This position should also be reiterated in the order nominating people to attend the Promotion Cadre Course.


