CIRCULAR NO. 105

(Regarding Departmental Enquiries).

.....

It has come to my notice that the way and speed with which the departmental enquiries are being conducted and finalised in most of the cases is far from satisfactory. There are instances that in certain cases a departmental enquiry was kept in abeyance by the officer conducting the same only on the grounds that a case (for the same charge for which D.E. is held) against the accused officer is pending decision of the Court. This is not a valid ground for delaying the departmental proceedings. These are quite different from judicial proceedings and have

no bearing on each other and as such, it is enjoined on all Gazetted Officers that all Departmental enquiries pending with them on these grounds should be completed and finalized within a month according to rules. There is no bar for the prosecution of a Government servant in the Court of law, who has been departmentally punished for the same offence. However, in case the officer holding a D.E. finds no grounds for punishing a delinquent officer, against whom a case is pending trial in the Court of Law for the same, he should not pass orders of exoneration till the decision of the Court.
