CIRCULAR ORDER NO. 92. ✓

An instance has come to notice where secret documents pertaining to the Rules and Regulations for the protection of the P. Ps. of Foreign countries while residing or passing through India have been misplaced in a responsible office. It cannot be over-emphasised that as the security of high personages is involved it must always be made sure that such documents are kept in proper personal custody of the officers who are supposed to handle them. In order that there may be no chance of mis-placement or loss of secret documents in future, a register should be started in which the receipt of such documents should be entered as soon as these are received and their distribution, if any, indicated. While handing over charge each Officer concerned should also include in the charge report a statement of the transfer of such documents from the outgoing to the incoming officer. An entry to this effect should also find place in the register to be maintained by the Ss. P. D.Is.G. and others.

2. The Ss.P. and D.Is.G. will send a statement to the DIG CID & IB Rajasthan, on 1st January and 1st July showing the secret documents held in their charge.
3. The loss of a secret documents will be viewed with great seriousness and action will be taken against the defaulting officer.
